

The Fossil Fuels behind Forest Fires and its accompanying [peer-reviewed article](#) in Environmental Research Letters utilized data on the corporate emissions of the world's largest 88 fossil fuel producers and cement manufacturers to determine the contribution of those emissions to worsening wildfires in western North America. The 88 major carbon producers included in the study are listed below.
